### SIGNIS WORLD CONGRESS 2022

15~18 August, Jeong Hasang Hall, Sogang University





The SIGNIS World Congress took place in person and online from August 15-18, 2022, at Sogang University in Seoul, South Korea. With participants from over 34 countries, it was masterfully organized by SIGNIS Korea under the lead of Daniel Hang Seung-soo, former Prime Minister of the country.

The congress was centered around the topic of “peace in the digital world” and featured panels discussing fake news and loss of trust, how we live in a hyperconnected world yet feel alone, and the protection of our common home. The event also invited attendees to discover the history, culture, innovation, and beauty of the Korean peninsula by going on cultural activities, visiting the border with North Korea, and exploring the premises of the leading broadcaster in the country, KBS.

The SWC allowed skillful communicators from around the globe to gather and discuss today’s most crucial topics for the journalism world, sharing ideas from their personal experiences in their countries and receiving insights from prominent figures like Dr. Paolo Ruffini, Prefect of the Vatican’s Dicastery for Communication. Furthermore, they could connect with those attending the conference through the specially-created metaverse platform.



The SIGNIS World Congress immersed attendees in the captivating phenomenon of the Korean Wave, *Hallyu*. Through delving into the immensely diverse culture of the nation, participants gained insights into the allure that Korea holds for people worldwide, particularly the younger generation. Spanning a history of millennia, a vibrant cuisine, and cutting-edge technology, the Congress was an extraordinary occasion to be truly awestruck by Korea.





# Communication, Democracy and Peace ▶



At the International Journalists Forum, that took place in Seoul on August 16th, Dmitry Muratov – founder of the Russian newspaper Novaya Gazeta and winner of the 2021 Nobel Peace Prize – was interviewed about the role of journalists in safeguarding peace.

He said, “the best way to respond to propaganda is by using the standards of professionalism and reporting facts, resisting the wave of unsolicited and unverified information spreading on social media”.



Titus Brandsma, the soon-to-be canonized Carmelite saint, isn't just a theologian; his legacy as a journalist holds profound relevance. Amidst Nazi occupation in 1939 Netherlands, Brandsma boldly resisted Hitler's tyranny, labeling the Nazi movement a "black lie." He defended press freedom and the Catholic press, making him a marked figure. Today, as attacks on journalists persist globally, his message resonates. Facing enforced conformity, Brandsma's mission to defy Nazi press control showcased his dedication to expression. Captured and executed at Dachau, Brandsma's sacrifice reverberates in the fight for truth. His canonization near World Press Freedom Day 2023 reinforce the enduring importance of unwavering journalistic integrity against oppressive forces.



In a special issue of SIGNIS Media members from around the world offer their views on the state of open communications in their area.

Autocratic governments recognize the importance of the link between freedom of speech and democracy — one of the first things they do upon taking power is muzzle or shut down news media. The forward march in these times of populist, authoritarian, fascist movements poses a real threat to democracies everywhere. If, "In war, truth is the first casualty," in a world in war the independent journalists may be all that stands between truth and lies about the horrible human suffering that is unfolding.





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I encourage you to persevere in these efforts, paying particular attention to the need to assist people, especially young people, to develop a sound critical sense, learning to distinguish truth from falsehood, right from wrong, good from evil, and to appreciate the importance of working for justice, social concord, and respect for our common home.



## Youth Forum ►

The International Youth Forum featured young SIGNIS members from six countries who came together in Seoul to share their experiences and hopes for digital evangelization. Reflecting on marketing strategies, listening with the ear of the heart, and creating engaging content, the participants took the stage to give their fresh views on the future of communications.



# Protection of our common home ►



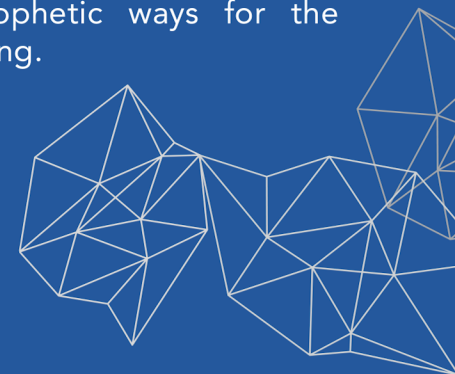
At the SIGNIS World Congress, keynote speaker Cynthia Moe-Lobeda – American Lutheran ethicist – said “Communication experts have a strong and crucial role in the sacred work of ecological/economic conversion. A role in enabling change in all three levels (individual, social and consciousness) of ecological conversion”.



At the conference, Argentinian Sol Didiego presented "Unfold Nest", a SIGNIS project done by 9 young media professionals from different parts of the world as "...an invitation to new narratives that promote mindful lifestyles based on planetary, dialogical and interconnected perspectives. We wanted ... to invite travelers to take part in a deschooling trip like the one we went through while creating it."



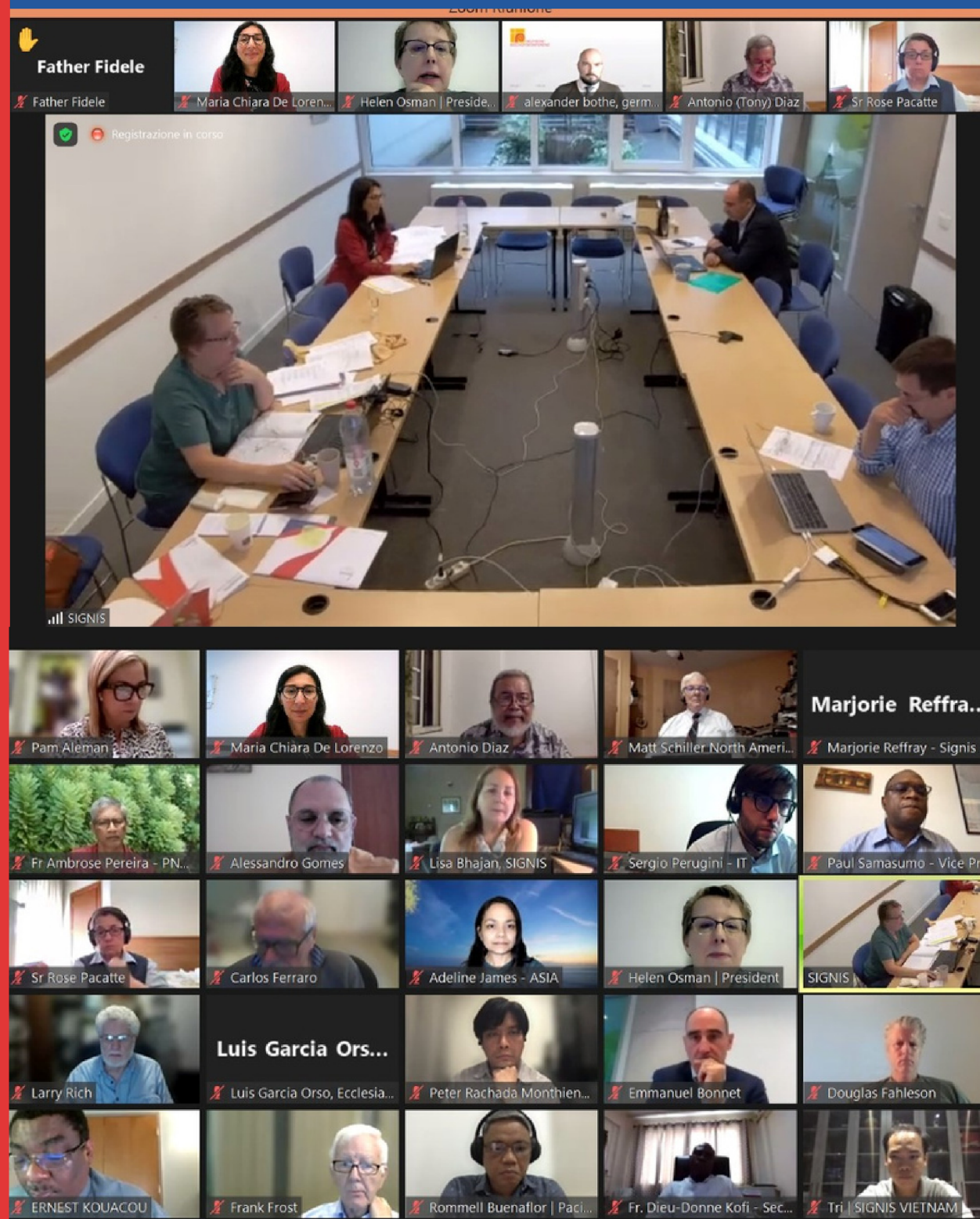
Mexican Kike Delgado presented the rise of regenerative culture as a response to the search for sustainable, friendly and prophetic ways for the environmental crisis we are living.

# Talent+ CommLab alumni workshop ►



As CommLab alumni, Edgar from Indonesia and Tae from Thailand wanted to pass down what they had learned, even if they were in different countries. In December 2021, Edgar launched the training program "Official Social Media Management" for Catholic leaders in Indonesia, which attracted 30 participants from various dioceses and congregations to learn how to face hoaxes and the decline of social awareness. With Tae's virtual contribution, the training explained how to create meaningful content that speaks to people and has the power to bring about changes. Their efforts underscore the significance of relationships in community development.

On the 65th Anniversary of the SIGNIS Jury at the San Sebastián Film Festival, the Jury's award went to "Los Reyes del Mundo," directed by Colombian filmmaker Laura Moral. The jury recognized the values of solidarity, fraternity, and the search for an ideal capable of responding to the demands of justice, goodness, and truth that the human heart yearns for. Los Reyes del Mundo depicts the journey of five young people escaping crime and corruption, with the intention of reclaiming a family land. The film invites us to question ourselves about the world that younger generations inherit and invite us to reflect on how we can improve it. This year's SIGNIS Jury was made up of Philippe Cabrol, Fr. Edorta Kortadi, and its president, Carlos Aguilera Albasa.





## Stories of healing for young lives ►

Colombian film director Laura Mora has a special sensitivity for the stories of young people in vulnerable situations in a society that is daily confronted by violence. With her script and direction, "Killing Jesus" (2017) and "The Kings of the World" (2022) were at the San Sebastian Film Festival and received prizes from the SIGNIS Jury. "Killing Jesus" the special prize for the association's 60 years of presence at the festival and "The Kings of the World" the prize of the 2022 edition. The latter also won the Golden Shell, the highest prize of the festival and one of the most prominent of the film industry around the world.





Finding inspiration in Pope Francis' encyclical *Fratelli Tutti*, the latest issue of the CineMag SIGNIS was focused on cinema through the magnifying glass of inclusion.

As Saint Francis who "sowed seeds of peace and walked alongside the poor, the abandoned, the infirm and the outcast, the least of his brothers and sisters", many filmmakers are offering a reflection of our world in crisis.



# SIGNIS Asia Radio Competition ►



The "Engaging the Youth for a Dynamic Radio Uniting Asia and the World" event, initially postponed due to COVID-19, took place from May 9-12, 2022, in Sri Lanka.

Organized by SIGNIS ASIA and the SIGNIS Radio Desk, it highlighted radio's evangelization potential, especially for marginalized communities, and gave a significant stage to many young people involved in radio broadcasting.

The event stressed pluralism, networking, and sustainability, encouraging partnerships for a more dynamic radio environment, while the attendees engaged in collaborative methods, dialogue on synodal communication, and learned about entrepreneurship and succession planning.

This encounter emphasized youth participation and their impact on the future of radio along with encompassing radio's professionalism, podcast innovation and broadcasting. Ahead of the event, there was an International Youth Podcast Competition open to submissions from around the world. The winner, Dayanara Ortiz, from Ecuador, was flown to Sri Lanka for the event. The rest of the podium was comprised of Kate Salcedo, Peru; Rachel Diez, Cuba; Jean Paul Campos, Costa Rica; and Richard Oyeleke, Nigeria.

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The most interesting thing about the contest is that it posed the challenge of conceiving materials that would bring Pope Francis' encyclical *Fratelli Tutti* closer to a younger audience. A public with different access to technologies, with a preference for more interactive and closer narratives and stories. The goal was to do so without losing the profound human value and Christian roots of the document, capable of speaking to very different people in different contexts.

# SSR Projects: Radio Hekima & Communications Center in Belize ▶

Radio Hekima was greatly welcomed since its launch as it quickly became a source of information to keep people safe during the pandemic. Mbinga was one of the areas least affected by COVID-19, in part thanks to how well-prepared people were as they had learned from Radio Hekima how to protect themselves. From the very start, people knew they could trust Radio Hekima.



In an area with very limited access to media, the tenacity and hard work of H.E. Bishop John Ndimbo, alongside the support of SIGNIS Services Rome, brought to life this radio station which now broadcasts programs about education, environmental awareness, human rights, health, cultural diversity, female empowerment, youth development, sports, entertainment, and local, national, and international news.

Meaning “wisdom” in the local language Swahili, Radio Hekima’s goal is to reach and serve all Tanzanians: children, church and political leaders, farmers, the elderly, youth, women... people from all paths of life. The radio station aims at improving the rural communities in their social and economic development; to be more in contact with society, justice, and peace.



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As more and more people started to tune in, they turned to Radio Hekima to get advice on how to take care of the soil, learn new skills, receive catechism, and entertain themselves. This new broadcaster made it possible for the people of Mbinga to make their voices heard while also becoming more aware of the world that surrounds them.





Supplied with audio and video equipment for conferences and recording, computers, projectors, speakers, and much more, the first communications center of the **Diocese of Belize City and Belmopan** is a place of gathering for people of all ages and backgrounds that wish to get closer to technology, communications, and the Church.

This communications center aims to explore **new ways of being Church in the digital milieu** and to understand what it means to evangelize through the use of technology. The center is on its way to becoming a resource center for teachers, youth leaders, and other groups, who can use it to plan and carry out their programs using technology.

At the same time, the center looks to educate and train people, particularly youth, on the efficient use of media tools. In 2022, they carried out the first two virtual trainings: one on "Podcasting and the power of audio storytelling", by Maria Victoria La Terza, and "WordPress and website design" by Luca Mercurio.



**"I had always wanted to do a podcast but I was afraid of using my own voice - I'm not too scared now",** said one of the participants of the podcasting course.





The Diocese of Belize City and Belmopan's communication center wants to respond to the needs of their people to be more connected, more united, more informed, and in better touch with their faith. By becoming a place of encounter, where people can share their ideas and collaborate, while also having access to top-notch media equipment and trainings, this is definitely a project to keep an eye on!

These trainings are just the beginning of what the communications center aims to do. They are hoping to involve more people in courses about social media and media literacy, which are very much needed in today's fast-evolving digital world.







## SIGNIS With You Live ►

Launched in June 2020, SIGNIS With You Live is a Facebook Live show that takes the viewer around the world to discover media projects SIGNIS is involved in and the remarkable work it does to support communicators globally, share stories of impact, and promote the use of media for peace.

SIGNIS members from the six active desks (journalism, cinema, television, radio, media education, and digital) are featured as special guests; and in its third season, the show moved from SIGNIS Services Rome's page to the international SIGNIS World Facebook page, aiming to reach an even wider audience and with the goal of featuring the work of SIGNIS members from around the world.

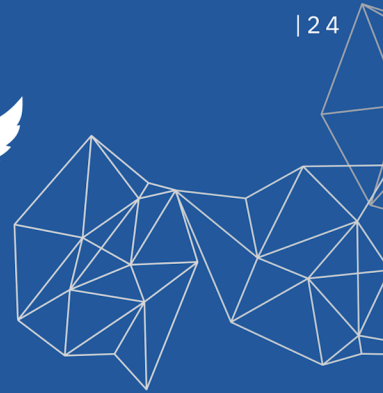




Pastoral Communication in the Digital Age: reality, reflections and response” is a booklet produced by the SIGNIS Digital Desk about the pastoral challenges in the age of Information and Communications Technology (ICT). It shares a reflection about understanding ICT in light of the Church’s pastoral communication and how to respond to the pastoral challenges the new world of communication technologies brings up.







Communication must be critically examined for its ability to sow the seeds of conflict instead of unity, misunderstanding instead of reconciliation, and hatred instead of charity. Listening to how marginalized people communicate their experiences in their established digital spaces will enable pastoral leaders to better understand and more effectively 'speak' and 'respond' to the pastoral needs specific to each group.

There is a need for the Church and its pastoral leaders to skillfully and wisely navigate the realm of technology in order to put this gift granted by God to the best use. This demands that pastoral leaders and faith communicators have a good grasp of the various dimensions of ICT - the social, economic, political, ecological, and spiritual short-term and long-term implications for the Church and the world.



## COMLAC Panama ▶

The Sixth Latin American and Caribbean Communication Congress (VI COMLAC) brought together over 350 communicators, communication researchers and students from several Latin American and Caribbean countries to reflect and exchange ideas and experiences on the theme “Communication, Interculturality and Spirituality for Social Transformation”.

The Congress took place on July 13 and 14 at the Universidad Santa María la Antigua in Panama City, Panama. The meeting featured academic lectures, debates and workshops on various topics related to the challenges of communication in today's society and saw the presence of 11 renowned researchers and academics from Latin America and Europe.

During the closing ceremony, the award “Communicator of Peace” was presented. It recognizes communicators who have promoted the construction of a culture of peace, justice and fraternity throughout their communicational trajectory.

From among the 16 nominations received from various countries of the region, it was decided to award the prize to Brazilian media education professional, Sr. Helena Corazza (Lifetime Achievement category), and to Cuban journalist and audiovisual critic Gustavo Andújar (In Memoriam category).
